## FROM OUR INTERIM PASTOR

### STEWARDSHIP SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 12

November 12 is Stewardship Commitment Sunday. At the heart of stewardship is generosity, which is at the heart of Christian discipleship. Stewardship/Generosity is more than just being financially gracious, it is a way of life, a spirit, a grace. Stewardship/Generosity is the way in which Jesus called his followers into the world, pouring out compassion, hospitality, companioning presence, and courageous justice. For if the willingness is there, the gift is acceptable according to what one has, not according to what one does not have.

Every day, most of us spend more time than we realize thinking about or making decisions about money. How will we pay the rent or mortgage? Should I look for a new job for more money? Can I buy these sneakers now or do I wait for a sale? Do I need to buy this new cell phone or tablet? Will we get the right price for this harvest? Will the loan come through for another year of college?

As followers of Jesus Christ, we would like to say we consult the Lord about these thoughts and decisions. What if we realize Jesus is the last person we consider when we worry and wonder about that investment, job, vacation, new (or pre-owned) device, gadget, truck, house, etc? Even if we tithe, could it be that cultural expectations, advertisements, the latest travel and home improvement shows or our peers and preferences are driving financial decisions more than our faith?

Sometimes we say, "I give my 10%, so I should get to do what I want with the rest." But, what we do with all is also a reflection of our faith.

In John 6:8-9, we read the story of the boy who gave all that he had. The child gave his lunch to Jesus. He gave his whole lunch, not just part of it. The child and so many others were fed. Did this child know that if he trusted Jesus with all he had for himself, something miraculous would happen? When we give to God, God will take care of us and so many others. I challenge you to take one week during November to pray over every penny you have to spend. Ask the question of how God would have you use these pennies, nickels, dimes, quarters, dollars, and so on. And as we pay the bills and make purchases, may we dedicate everything to God's purposes. Jesus calls each of us to let go of the prevailing messages of our culture and become generous disciples.

### THANKSGIVING SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 19

Sunday, November 19 is Thanksgiving Sunday. This is a special Sunday where we come together in corporate worship in giving thanks to God for who he is and what he has done for us! A special Thanksgiving offering will be received on that day. I encourage you to give a liberal offering in appreciation for the many blessings that God continues to bestow upon us.

## STEWARDSHIP NUGGETS

- ❖ What is stewardship? Simply stated, stewardship is using the gifts God has given us, to do the things God asks (calls!) us to do.
- ❖ Did you know...  
The Bible deals with our possessions in:
  - Over 2,100 verses
  - 1/6 of New Testament
  - 2/3 of Jesus' parables
    - OR
  - Two-thirds of Jesus' parables have to do with our possessions. There are 500 verses on prayer, 500 on faith and 2,000 on things we accumulate. In the four gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke and John), 1 out of 7 verses deal with giving or sharing with the world.
- ❖ Stewardship is discipleship. How much is yours? How much is God's? Actually, all we have, all we are, belongs to God. Everything!
- ❖ The 4 D's of stewardship: Desire -> Decision -> Discipline -> Delight - Rev. Henry Wildeboer
- ❖ Christ's standard for giving is not how much we give, but how much we hold back for Stewardship of Time: The secret to time management is not learning how to save time or to get more of it; the secret is knowing how to use it.
- ❖ Trusting comes before giving. It teaches a reliance on God that is fundamental to our relationship with Him.
- ❖ Contentment is not the fulfillment of what you want, but the realization of how much you already have.
- ❖ Christian giving is the normal, steady, increasing outflow of the Christian life.
- ❖ Christ's standard for giving is not how much we give, but how much we hold back for ourselves. – T.A. Kantonen
- ❖ Stewardship is not a destination, it is a process.
- ❖ Stewardship is not how much we give, it is how we live.


## FOOD PANTRY MINISTRY

We open our Food Pantry every Friday morning from 8:00 a.m. to 9:30 a.m., 50 weeks a year. The program is designed to provide a bag of groceries for needy families who are hungry with no questions asked. We are able to serve all nationalities including Latinos, Caucasians, Asians, African Americans and others reflecting the neighbor-hood's diverse population. Each Friday, we order the next week's food from the Los Angeles Regional Food Bank. The food is delivered the following Monday. Each month, we send a report back to the Los Angeles Food Bank with the results. Over the last year, we gave out 2,000 bags of groceries (1 bag per family) that provided food for more than 5,000 family members! Many of our neighbors want fresh food, like vegetables and fruit. We are working our partners to develop a plan so that our community can have access to fresh fruits and vegetables.
